

## McKeon Ready to Go Zone with Grower Groups

Mark McKeon, one of Australia's leading motivational speakers is hitting the road with the Grower Group Alliance (GGA) this March.

Mark, an ex AFL player and High performance coach runs his own business that provides; conference, training and coaching services to organisations across the globe, all whilst still working 30 hours a week and taking 10 weeks of holiday a year.

Mark, will be touring the state in GGA's Biannual Speaker Series in partnership with Partners in Grain (PinG), speaking at seven regional events about the importance of developing and maintaining a good work-life balance.

Agriculture is an extremely intensive business, with many on farm activities being time critical, where farmers can end up spending up to 16 hours a day trying to get their jobs done, said Rebecca Wallis, GGA Project Leader.

"Mark has a great approach to engaging audiences and has many techniques that can help farmers manage their work-life balance," Ms Wallis said.

With fatigue not only being the primary contributor to many agricultural accidents, it can also cause or exacerbate underlining mental health issues.

According to PinG's WA Coordinator Erin Green, "One of Mark's key messages that resonates really well with farming and rural life is that it's ok to have stress and be stressed at periods, but it's how we manage it that makes the difference."

"I would love to see not only farmers but their staff, families and other rural community members at Mark's presentation so that communities as a whole can have a better understanding of how to handle the tough times and the peak periods that farming has," said Ms Green.

This is Mark's third visit to WA as he was the keynote speaker at the GGA's Annual Forum in August, and at the GRDC Farm Business Updates in Merredin in March last year.

"Everyone is multitasking these days, juggling numerous responsibilities and feeling time poor. Mark's "go zone" is such a simple but effective way of working productively and keeping a good work life balance - I know it's helped me since hearing Mark at last year's GGA Annual Forum.". said Ms Green.
